ANNUAL AWARDS BANQUET

AWARD CRITERIA

Each coach shall give to the Athletic Director a list of those squad members in good standing at the conclusion of each season. These boys and girls shall be guests at the banquet, paid for by the Board of Education. All other guests and the main speaker are paid for by the Varsity Club. Cheerleaders, managers, and interscholastic sport squad members and coaches are invited. The banquet is held in June.

Special Awards (presented at the banquet)

Andy Vernoooy Award - This award is presented to the outstanding track man for the current year. The one that best exemplifies the spirit, hard work, and determination exhibited by Andy in the pioneer days of track at Spencerport. A trophy is presented, paid for by the Student Union, and the name of the winner is inscribed on a permanent plaque.

MVP/MIP Awards - These awards are purchased by the Lions Club and Rotary for Most Valuable (MVP) and Most Improved (MIP) players. The coach of each sport presents the trophies along with the Lion Club and Rotary presidents. These awards are decided by a vote of the team members.

Harold "Chick" Schum Award - This trophy is presented in honor of Harold "Chick" Schum, athletic director from 1934-70, to a senior boy for athletic ability, citizenship, and scholastic achievement. The trophy is paid for by the Student Union. The winner has his name put on a permanent plaque. The selection is by the athletic staff.

Joan P. Selander Award - This trophy is presented in honor of Joan P. Selander, who was a member of the Spencerport Soccer Club and instrumental in the development of the SSBC, to a senior girl for athletic ability, citizenship, and scholastic achievement. The trophy is paid for by the Student Union. The winner's name is put on a permanent plaque. The selection is by the athletic staff.

Rob Stultz Memorial Award - This award is presented in memory of Rob Stultz, a Spencerport student-athlete who passed away on November 28, 1998, during a basketball scrimmage. It is awarded to the female and male student-athlete who best exemplifies the characteristics that Rob demonstrated – team play, effort, attendance, and sportsmanship. The selection is based on voting by the varsity coaches. A plaque is presented to the female and male award winner at the annual banquet. The female and male award winner names are also put on a permanent plaque.

Duane Tucker Award - This trophy is presented to the Senior boy who has attained the greatest number of points as determined by the following sheet, listing the criteria. This is primarily an Academic Athlete Award in honor of Mr. Tucker who was teacher and principal at Spencerport from 1938 to 1969. This is paid for by the Student Union and the winner's name is engraved on a permanent plaque.

Spencerport Sports Booster Club Award - This trophy is presented to the Senior girl who has attained the greatest number of points as determined by the following sheet, listing the criteria. This is primarily an Academic Athlete Award. This is paid for by the SSBC and the winner's name is engraved on a permanent plaque.

Hall of Fame Award - This is an award presented to one person each year who has been an outstanding athlete in the past. A plaque is presented, the winner's name is inscribed on a permanent plaque, and a picture is mounted and framed to hang in the Hall of Fame. The recipient is the guest of honor at the annual banquet. Selections are made from nominations made by the staff and past graduates of the school. An information sheet is kept on file in the athletic director's office. Each year the graduating class is screened for future award nominees and these are announced at the annual banquet. This award is paid for by the Student Union.

Highest Award for Spencerport Central School Athlete
(Schum, Selander)

Part A:

1. Six or more letters
2. Four letters in one sport
3. All-League in two sports, Section V Champions
4. All-State, State Champions, All-American Selection
5. Coaches and Athletic Directors recommendation

Part B:

1. Recommended athletes are compiled on ballot to varsity coaches along with a brief critique of each athletes letters, All-League, All-State, All-American and other sports awards outside of school competition.
2. Coaches rank all athletes from #1 choice to last possible choice. If there are 8 nominees, they are ranked 1-8. Male sport coaches vote for Schum Award; female sport coaches vote for Selander Award.
3. Athletic Director tallies ballots deleting the highest and lowest ballot for each individual athlete. The lowest point total will win!

1. Student grade point average multiplied times 100 points.
2. Number of varsity letters x 10; maximum of 6.
3. Number of times a varsity captain x 10.
4. Number of times sectional champion, All-League, All- County x 20
5. Number of times All-State or State Champion X 20
6. Number of time All-American x 20

B. Alternative:

1. Minimum # of letters 2/3/4
2. Minimum GPA - B
3. Number of sports participated in
