Nature Center History

he Spencerport Nature Center (SNC) is a near 30-acre preserve

cated on the Southeast corridor of our district campus. Bordered by Spencerport Road on the North and Route 31 on the South, the nature center provides our



school district and the Spencerport community with a venue for learning, exploring and enjoying the outdoors. Located in the Village of Spencerport and on the Spencerport Central School District Campus, we invite you to enjoy this area.

The SNC has heritage connected back to the early 1800 with settlers like J.T. Trowbridge who writes about this area when reflecting on his youth. Over the last several decades, this area has been occasionally used by teachers in our school district for instructional purposes.

In 2003, a vision blossomed to expand and maintain the area as a functional outdoor classroom. In 2010, the newly formed Nature Center Committee developed is mission to ensure the continued growth and integrity of this environment area. In 2017, an addition of an Instructional Pavilion, as the result of an Eagle Scout project, has furthered the functional use of the Nature Center as an outdoor classroom.

The Nature Center was dedicated on September 17, 2011. The Spencerport Nature Center Committee looks forward to a long history of educational experiences, recreational activities and special events hosted at the nature center.
